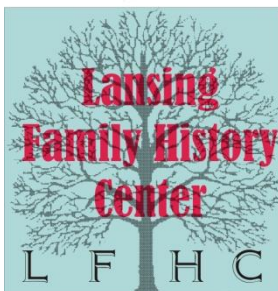

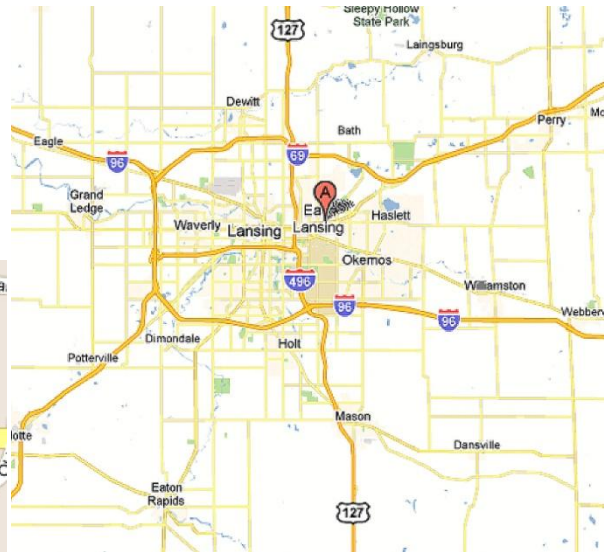
**A FEW SUGGESTIONS:**

**DIRECTIONS to 431 E Saginaw Hwy, East Lansing:**  
 On the north side of Saginaw Highway (Business 69) just 1 ½ blocks east of Abbot Road, ¾ miles west of Hagadorn Road. Enter at the back (north side) of the building. (Use MapQuest or Google Maps, etc. for more detailed directions on locating the Seminar site).



DOORS OPEN at 8:00am to pick up Handouts (Class List, Building Map, Evaluation Form, etc.) Then, proceed to the North Cultural Hall to get your name tag (it will have class #'s) and pick up your syllabus, if you ordered and paid for a SYLLABUS in advance.
